Individual Gaelic Leaguers are also appealed to help the College, as the needs of the institution are increasing year by year. At the last meeting of the committee it was decided to ask the Rev. Gearold O'Muallain, M A, St. Malachy's College, Belfast, to take up the duties of teacher of method during the coming seasons. A satisfactory reply has been received from An tAthair O'Muallain. His fitness for the position is unquestioned and the committee has been fortunate in securing him. Besides being a practical teacher and being acquainted with the direct method of language teaching, An tAthair O'Muallain has the advantage that he knows thoroughly what is need at Colaisde na Mumhan, as he was a student there himself for the past two sessions. With An tAthair O'Dalaigh as Ard Oilash and An tAthair O'Muallain as teacher of method and the assistants which are to be appointed, Colaisde na Mumhan courses of 1907 may be looked forward to by the students as a distinct advance upon any previous courses.
